## **Understanding the Crisis in Seattle & Bellevue**

The Seattle and Bellevue metro areas are experiencing a significant surge in the unhoused population. As of the 2024 Point-in-Time Count, King County reported over 14,000 individuals experiencing homelessness—a 22% increase since 2022. Seattle alone accounted for more than 10,000 of those individuals, while Bellevue's numbers have doubled over the past five years.

This rise has been exacerbated by housing costs, substance use disorders, mental health challenges, and pandemic-era economic instability. Local governments have declared states of emergency, but the crisis continues to strain public spaces, infrastructure, and resources.

#### **Key Contributing Factors**

- Housing Affordability: Seattle ranks among the top five most expensive
  U.S. cities to rent or own property. Wages have not kept pace with housing costs, pushing low-income residents into homelessness.
- Mental Health and Substance Use: Roughly 45% of King County's unhoused population live with untreated mental health conditions, often co-occurring with substance abuse disorders.
- Lack of Shelter Capacity: Despite increased funding, local shelters and transitional housing options remain at or over capacity.



## **Legislative & Governmental Responses**

- Right of Way Initiative (2022): Washington State and King County collaborated to remove encampments from public right-of-way areas, particularly near roadways and underpasses.
- U.S. Supreme Court Ruling (2024): Affirmed the right of municipalities to ban public camping even when shelter is unavailable, paving the way for expanded encampment removals.
- Seattle's "One Roof" Initiative (2023): Consolidated homelessness response across agencies to streamline outreach and increase housing placements.

Still, enforcement of these initiatives remains inconsistent, leaving property managers, retailers, and municipalities with the burden of managing public safety and sanitation concerns.

## Impact by Sector


#### 1. Commercial Real Estate

Challenges: Unhoused individuals setting up encampments near or on commercial property can lead to loitering, vandalism, sanitation concerns, and deter potential tenants or customers. This often results in declining property values and increased operational costs.

### PalAmerican's Response:

 Deployment of highly visible patrol officers trained in de-escalation and compassionate engagement.

Perimeter checks and detailed incident reporting to identify vulnerable entry points and recurring issues.





### 2. High-Rises

Challenges: Downtown high-rise buildings—especially mixed-use office and residential towers—often face unauthorized entry attempts, elevator loitering, and encampments in underground garages or alleyways.

#### PalAmerican's Response:

- Concierge-style officers who deliver both tenant-facing customer service and vigilant security enforcement.
- Integrated surveillance monitoring via our Security Operations Center (SOC) to support 24/7 visibility.
- Enforcement of access control procedures and emergency preparedness planning with building management.

#### 3. Transit

Challenges: Transit hubs and bus stops are frequent gathering places for unhoused individuals, creating operational disruptions and raising safety concerns for commuters and transit staff.

#### PalAmerican's Response:

- Transit-specific officers equipped to engage respectfully and resolve conflicts using trauma-informed communication.
- On-site presence at terminals, platforms, and park-and-rides to discourage illicit activity and provide commuter reassurance.
- Partnering with transit authorities to enforce code of conduct policies and collaborate with behavioral health teams where applicable.
